## COURSE SELECTION INSTRUCTIONS

- **Enrichment Electives Week-At-A-Glance (WAAG)**
  - **Wednesday, December 11, after 5 p.m.: Enrichment Electives Week-at-a-Glance Preview (WAAG) posted on SYCAMORE**
  - Read closely these Instructions, Course Descriptions, and the WAAG; Review offerings with your child(ren) & make 2 choices per period in order of preference (labeling as “1” and “2”).
  - See required courses to select (e.g., CONNECT Circles, Study Skills); read about these on the Course Descriptions page. Accreditors wish to see students in a variety of classes, so avoid selecting multiple classes of the same type (e.g., P.E., art, music).
- **Selections Selected via Survey Monkey Link**
  - **Wednesday, December 18, after 6 p.m.: NEW! Selection Link posted for each grade on Sycamore**
  - For each child, select the LINK associated with each child’s grade and complete each selection with choices “1” and “2.” Select separate LINKS for subsequent children in the family according to his/her grade.
  - *Do not attempt to submit your form any other way or personally to any staff member; as it cannot be accepted.*
  - Courses are filled on a “first come, first served” basis with Seniors having enrollment priority.
  - **Financial and Partnership accounts must be current!** Students with past due accounts (financial or Partnership hours) will not be logged into elective rosters until their family account is made current. Please contact the Admin Office if you have questions about your account.
  - **Monday, December 23 by 4 p.m.: Selection Sheets due to avoid a \$50 late fee**
  - **Space in courses is limited, and courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.** Please do not delay in returning your form (e.g., 100+ received within 24 hours after Selection Sheets posted). Earlier submission improves chances to get chosen courses. Preference to 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders in meeting necessary credits.
  - Courses will be filled to scheduled capacity; those with insufficient enrollment will be dropped. Affected schedules are adjusted to next choice for that day/period. Note: Athletes on teams will not be scheduled for alternative P.E. electives that are reserved for non-team students needing P.E. credits.
- **A \$50 Change Fee** due for changes received after your Selections are submitted to PCCS. **No change requests accepted after January 10.**
- **High School Students, esp. Juniors and Seniors:** To determine what courses you need to graduate on time, see the Graduation Checklist reviewed during your College & Career consultations. Blank Graduation Checklists are loaded on Sycamore at the Documents|C&C tab.
- **How to read the Enrichment Elective WAAG:**
  - Periods for M-Th electives class periods:
    - Primer, 1st grade and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade - 1<sup>st</sup> period
    - 3<sup>rd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> graders – 7<sup>th</sup> period
    - 5<sup>th</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> graders - 6<sup>th</sup> period
    - 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> are scheduled for M-Th 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> periods
  - Abbreviations: JH = Jr High (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>); HS = High School (9<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup>).
  - Teacher/Instructor Name is followed by the Room Assignment in the parentheses of each course listing. Courses in GREEN are two-days.
  - The type of graduation credit appears 1<sup>st</sup> (see abbreviations on each page) followed by the course title, days offered, instructor name and room assignment.
  - **Course surcharges (“\*” on the schedule):**
    - A few courses are taught by independent contractor adjunct instructors (e.g., all Dance, Percussion) who charge higher rates (than for other courses) for which a surcharge is due to break even in those courses.
    - Surcharges also apply to Tutoring\* (\$10-\$20 per session; see Course Description), Fast ForWord (M.-Th.+F. a.m. @ \$20/wk for 5 days).
    - Other surcharges apply for special classes (e.g., Pottery-self-curing Trinity Industries clay; Cooking-ingredient instructor reimbursement e.g. \$25; Praise/Worship Teams \$10/wk; special art classes; after school instruction or clubs such as Karate Day 2, e.g. \$5/wk)
  - **Private Pay (“PP”):** Private music lessons (electives & after school) and after school private Tutoring\* are paid directly to the teacher--typically \$20/session.

### REQUIRED COURSES:

Study Skills & Organization (Section I/Fall, Section II/Spring): All new students and those students referred by teachers or the Admin office (e.g., those with repeat Siberias, Progress Alerts, lower grades, weak organizational skills) or by the parents take this course designed to promote organizational skills and as well as important study habits for a successful student.

7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> Grades CONNECT Circles classes: Students in these grades must selection a combination of any 2 different CONNECT classes per semester. CONNECT Circles classes use different multi-denominational curricula each semester (primarily from [www.cbd.com](http://www.cbd.com)). CONNECT Circles teachers include Geron Bryan, Ruth Long, Crystal Sparks, Brian Risinger, Dallas McNeal, Michael Moonoo, Nia Rader, Mary Farmer, Marcus Ramirez, and Kristi Tollison.

CONNECT Circles A (Apologetics): Apologetic classes will be discussion-based with a teacher facilitator to engage in common questions that youth have about the Bible, the culture around us, and how to grow in faith in spite of non-Christian influences.

CONNECT Circles B (Bible): Bible classes will be surveys of the Old Testament, New Testament, or particular themes or Books of the Bible to reinforce basic Bible knowledge as the foundation of our faith.

CONNECT Circles C (Community Service: Missions & Children/Local Ministry): This course will focus on ministry to those beyond the PCCS campus (e.g. Terrell Share Center, nursing homes) and learning about those who commit their lives to missions. Upper school students interested in attending the Mission Trips next summer are expected to attend the Missions CONNECT class during THURSDAY LUNCH meetings scheduled this semester.

CONNECT Circles D (Discipleship): Discipleship classes will focus on how to help students develop their faith...how they live it out in their lives now and in the future as they leave home and PCCS.

### SPECIAL SERVICES, BY REFERRAL ONLY:

All grades, Tutoring\*: Students struggling with a core subject may enroll subject to approval; limit 2. Tutoring\* surcharges are billed lump sum by the semester: Fall - \$160 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$320 for one-on-one; Spring - \$180 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$360 for one-on-one.

### PRIVATE CLASSES:

> Private Guitar Lessons\* All Levels, All Styles, Electric, acoustic, ukulele &/or bass! During M-Th Electives, see the schedule for 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> periods and after school @ \$20/lesson for duo periods (or one-on-one full period lessons @\$40) paid directly to instructor, Igor

Kudelin. He is an instructor, a worship leader at The Vale Church, and musician who helps students gain skills & learn to play favorite songs.

> Private Piano Lessons\*-Beginner to Advanced Nataly Kudelin, Doctorate in Piano, teaches beginner to advanced students; see electives during 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> periods and after school @ \$20 for 1/2 period lesson paid directly to the instructor - or full period individual lessons available at \$40.

> **NEW!** Private Voice or Piano Lessons\* Cathy Ballew joins the PCCS music faculty this semester with a Masters in Music from SMU and years of experience teaching music, including vocal instruction since 2005. As with other private music lessons offered at PCCS, these are \$20/each for a 1/2 period paid directly to the instructor.

> Private Beginner Piano Lessons\* Piano instructor, Marisa Frankum, offers beginning piano during our 1<sup>st</sup> period to Primer and 1<sup>st</sup> graders! The curriculum is Faber "My First Piano Adventure for the Young Beginner," and lessons are \$20/each paid directly to the instructor.

> Private Drum or Guitar/Bass Lessons: Mark Austin continues as a PCCS music instructor; he is a professional career musician who also teaches youth drum and guitar/bass (in fact, his son is a virtuoso musician who has played at the Meyerson many times). He offers both group and individual lessons based upon interest shown on Selection Sheets @ \$20 each 1/2 period lesson, \$20 for each group session, \$40 for full period one-on-one lessons paid directly to the instructor.

### REGULAR ENRICHMENT COURSES (alphabetically):

Art: Drawings! **NEW!** Have fun with guided step-by-step drawing projects to explore your skills and creativity.

Beginning ASL II Enjoy this continuing ASL basics class (no prerequisite) from a certified ASL interpreter!

Bible: Power of Words and Armor of God **NEW!** This class will use two books of this title by Tony Evans; The Power of Words teaches children that their words have "superpowers" to hurt or to heal; the program shows how to speak carefully and prayerfully, build one another up, express gratitude, praise God, and point friends to Jesus. The Armor of God explains how Scripture reveals who's behind the world's traps and how to resist and defeat evil with a powerful suit of armor and mighty weapons including a belt of truth and helmet of salvation to wear and shield of faith to carry into the battle.

BoatUS **NEW!** Complete a Texas Parks & Wildlife Department online course approved by U.S. Coast Guard and the National Association of State Boating Law Administration (NASBLA) to satisfy mandatory education requirements for boaters and PWC operators born on or after Sept. 1, 1993.

Chess Challenge\* New and continuing students learn and improve their strategies and skills for this class—great for analytical and mathematical skill building! Students need to sign up & memorize their login for LICHESS.ORG before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of class.

Christian Character Trait of the Week **NEW!** As noted on Sycamore Flash News, each week has an assigned Christian Character Trait, and these will be the focus of the activities and stories explored in this class.

Co-ed Dance\* Primer, 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade BOYS & GIRLS have fun learning and improving dance skills in their 1<sup>st</sup> period Thursday elective; recital at end of semester. **NO JEANS;** proper P.E. Attire required/see Dress Code and teacher-required dance shoes.

**COMM Speech Competition** Practice speaking skills and prep for spring semester tournaments (ACSI/here; league speech meet/location TBA); meets Graduation Checklist requirement.

**Co-Ed Cub Scout Packs\*** Come one, come all! Scouts have fun and learn as they work on their den requirements! Once per month, there is a required Pack meeting after school. If you are looking for Parent Partnership hours, be a den leader and enjoy spending quality time with your child! Come join the adventurous world of scouting! **There is a \$34 annual registration fee with the national organization which includes yearly membership and Scout Magazine, plus a student-purchased uniform/rank appropriate scout shirt is required** (look on eBay, etc. used). **Parent leaders needed**; PAN Julie Cato, the PCCS Scouting Coordinator.

**Co-Ed Sewing NEW!** Everyone should know some basic sewing skills! In this class, students learn how to sew on buttons, hem, repair, and basic sewing tips!

**Dog Tricks & Training NEW!** Note: An adult must bring dog at 3 p.m. and no earlier (no personal dogs can be "boarded" on campus). No dogs permitted when there is inclement weather (e.g., rain, snow, sleet, below 45 degrees/the recess guideline)—in that case, class will be held in the Lewis room. Learn basic training strategies for obedience skills as well as some tricks such as sit, stay, shake and pray; **ALL DOGS MUST HAVE PROOF OF VACCINATION with a copy provided to the teacher on the first day of class.**

**Driver's Ed NEW!** At the request of parents, PCCS offers its first driver's education online course; this particular course offers a Certificate of Completion, Free Permit License Certificate electronically, 30-minute free personal coaching session, and parents complete the driving portion; if choosing this option, **go to the link and sign up before the first day of class.** Students will complete their 1<sup>st</sup> 6 hours, get their Permit License Certificate electronically, and then move into the rest of their required online class hours during this elective period. **Exam Prep (Math & English, TSI/ACT/SAT/PSAT) UPDATED!** Practice English or math skills needed for college entrance exams; 10<sup>th</sup> graders and up; **meets HS graduation requirement** **NOTE: Students must bring personal earphones/ear buds each week.**

**FA Artistic Journaling NEW!** Get ready to journal! In this class, we will create an artistic way to express ourselves, get organized, be inspired and have fun! Students should bring a journal/notebook, as well as favorite markers and pens...then, let's journal!

**FA Bible Journaling** Bring your Journal Bibles and pens/pencils; Learn Bible concepts and values as well as techniques for representing faith through artistic flares and key words and phrases as well as prayers/praises. **NOTE: STUDENTS MUST BRING THEIR OWN JOURNALING BIBLE AND BIBLE-SAFE MARKERS/PENCILS.**

**FA Contemporary Drumming** If you want to learn percussion, this is the class to learn it! Join instructor with tons of instructional and professional experience to learn the basic of drumming and playing with fun tunes. **Surcharge for independent contractor fee of \$15/wk; a real bargain over private lessons!**

**FA Mosaics NEW!** (Imagine and create various art projects that involve designing collages and mosaics throughout the semester)

**FA Pottery** (A popular offering is back; students learn to create pottery; competition opportunities in the spring; class utilizes self-curing clay from Trinity Industries in Dallas; meets .25 HS FA credit) **NOTE: \$20 supplies surcharge applies.**

**FA Theatre Willy Wonka** Lots of prep and rehearsals are required to be ready for the March 20-21-22 performances! **See SYCAMORE CALENDAR for after school and Friday rehearsals (click to see how long)**; Oompa-Loompa/Cooks sign up for 7<sup>th</sup> period elective (must have Auditioned; on Sycamore CALENDAR for 12-12-19). Squirrels (Primer-1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup>) appear in Act II only for after school rehearsals in February (see ACT 2 only Sycamore CALENDAR; in Theatre class, see costume purchases for Oompa-Loompas, Squirrels, Cooks, and Cast; **meets .5 HS Fine Arts or .5 Comm/Speech credit** PLUS 100 points toward HS Letter. (\$25 costume fee if costume provided by PCCS).

**FA Weaving** (A popular spring semester offering is back; students learn to create various projects using weaving skills for possible competition; class; meets .25 HS FA credit)  
**FL Beginning Spanish II NEW!** By request, PCCS offers beginning Spanish to younger students using a curriculum designed for short lessons that work well for an electives course.  
**Health II:** HS students are required to take Health to graduate; meets Graduation Checklist requirement.

**Home Ec: Smoothies! NEW!** A favorite returns! Classes held in the MPB Kitchen; a new smoothie to make and taste every week! **\$20 Semester surcharge for ingredients applies.**

**HONORS Broadcasting: PCCS News Team NEW!** Enter the next phase of the Broadcasting courses as students take on roles of producer and reporters for weather, local news, PCCS news, national/international news, and more...with the goal of offering pre-recorded and live reports throughout the semester; taught by a former owner of a radio station; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.

**HONORS ENG – Shakespeare's Tragedies NEW!** A study of several of Shakespeare's tragedies, among the greatest plays in the English language. Selections include Macbeth, Othello and Hamlet; Supplemented by film; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.

**HONORS DUAL CREDIT SOCIOLOGY\*** - Students gain college credit in this interesting course required for most college majors and transferrable to most colleges that offers theories, research, perspectives...filtered through a Christian focus) **STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT TVCC TO GAIN COLLEGE CREDIT—Check with the College & Career Office for details**

**HONORS HISTORY: 68 Lives II NEW!** HONORS HISTORY: 68 Lives II NEW! Study important aspects and periods in history through the lives of 68 people! **Continue** this exciting journey through history with **Noah's grandsons** to travel through the ancient civilizations of Babylon and **experience** Egypt through the eyes of Abraham, Joseph, and Moses; supplemented by outside reading and projects; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.

**HONORS TECH Yearbook Team:** Preapproval is required from Mrs. Phillips if not formerly in the class; preapproval dependent upon class size, strong computer skills, digital photography, and creativity. Students will work online. The team will brainstorm and work on the current year's yearbook in this creative class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade; meets .25 HS COMP credit.

**How Rude! NEW!** If you notice that you need work on your manners (or maybe your parents notice), this is the class for you! A dinner will be planned and enjoyed as a project. In this class, learn expectations for being polite & practice in class!

**Intro to Vet Tech II** This will be an intro course for the Vet Tech Certification program which is a multi-semester program using approved curricula; tests and progress reports required toward final certification (likely a 6-semester track); No prerequisite.

**Leaders 4 Life! NEW!** Learn valuable lessons on leadership, teamwork, social skills, communication, problem solving, decision making, planning and organizing; course uses an approved 4-H curriculum.

**Lone Star NEW!** Students will learn about the great state of Texas through fun activities such as plays, creative writing, poetry, art, crafts and virtual tours.

**Magic School Bus Adventures NEW!** A different book from this series will be read weekly with a fun activity

**Money Bright for Kids NEW!** Teens are required to take Dave Ramsey Money Mgt, and now younger students will learn about money & finances! This class will show the video-based money lessons and then activities and discussion follow; each segment features the adventures of five friends who discover an amazing money and finance facts including earning, saving, spending wisely, investing, credit, and donating

**PE Archery - Beginning and Intermediate NEW!** New classes for beginners and more advanced team students are offered; be sure to pick the correct one! Jeff Stapleton continues as instructor to teach archery skills, safety, and competition skills for the team class under the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP); school-owned bows are available or students may inquire with the coach as to what bow may be used after the first day of class.

**PE Boys'/Girls' JH, JV and Varsity Team Athletics** Players work on skills first until the formal season begins (Volleyball-August; Basketball-November; Baseball/Softball-Feb/March as per league rules) with after-school practices required at that time. For basketball team, the class is required in during the Fall & Spring semesters (no new students may join in the spring semester). Those interested in only Varsity Baseball or Softball should select the 7<sup>th</sup> period P.E. class for that sport; Game schedules are posted on Sycamore, right sidebar, and on the CALENDAR tab; meets .5 HS PE credit.

**PE Get Healthy NEW!** Elementary students get fit through calisthenics and outdoor fitness activities and games and learn about nutrition on inclement weather days.

**PE Karate –Christian Soldiers, White to Black Belts\*** Choose the belt class that matches the student's belt level at the start of a semester (e.g., white belt = beginners). This nationally-recognized program requires Bible memory & Christian character for belt testing; CS karate uniform required. *After-school sessions required for some belts to adequately prepare for belt testing; a semester instructor pass-thru surcharge of \$5/week = \$80 per semester is invoiced; for those students who Belt Test, the CS Belt Testing fee is \$35.*

**PE Social Dance\* NEW!** Students will learn and practice popular social dances and social dance etiquette from this new dance instructor, Mrs. Hockett, with many years of experience teaching all forms of dance privately and professionally. *Surcharge to cover independent contractor fee \$5 per session plus a free dance workshop for those students wishing to prepare for Formal.*

**Photography for Show & Competition\*** *DIGITAL CAMERA required to enroll;* students will learn the principles behind good photography including the 10 rules of composition, posing and lighting both indoors and outside.

**Praise Songs** Enjoy singing familiar praise songs as well as some new ones for performance at the end of semester recital.

**Route 66 Bible Journey NEW!** Get ready to encounter the New Testament as you travel on a "trip" through the 66 books of the Bible; new students to the course are welcome! This study breaks down each book of the Bible teaching main characters, events, and a timeline where

students travel through each book of the Bible and stop along the way to meet characters and explore events in each book.

**Skills for Life III NEW!** An amazing class where you learn about everything from envelope addressing, caulking a joint, to grilling a steak; a class teaches and works on a different life skill every week!

**Story Hour NEW!** If you like stories, then this class is for you! Age-appropriate selections will be introduced and read each week in this fun circle time.

**Study Hall-Proctored** Computer access available; space limited; must work on homework or quietly read to remain in class; *sleeping or not staying academically busy will result in referral to the campus cleanup team.*

**TECH Desktop Designing II** Use a variety of formatting tools to create effective communication; some possible activities include business letter, brochures, pamphlets, advertisements; taught by our computer instructor, Mrs. Beverly Caldwell; meets .25 HS TECH credit.

**TECH Digital Citizenship NEW!** A favorite of parents returns; learn what it means to have a digital profile that sticks with you forever; how to represent yourself safely and appropriately on social media; and how to use social media responsibly.

**TECH Digital Signage Basics & PowerPoint II** (new students permitted) Work individually and in teams to use software to develop skills to prepare, proof, edit, and post digital signage on the school's LCD hallway monitors; taught by our computer instructor, Mrs. Caldwell; meets .25 HS TECH credit.

**TECH Keyboarding Skills** In this tech-based world, typing well and fast is an essential school and career skill; students learn and practice the proper and most efficient way of keyboarding.

**TECH Toonly NEW!** In this tech-based animation course, students learn the variety of skills, including synchronizing sound, script, movement, and staging, required to create a Toonly infomercial, a skill they can use later in classes, for entertainment, college and the workplace.

**Villains & Heroes of the Bible NEW!** In this Bible stories class, students listen and explore the stories of the various characters of the Bible, bad and good, and what can be learned from those stories.
