COURSE SELECTION INSTRUCTIONS

➤ HOW DOES THE ENRICHMENT ELECTIVES PROCESS WORK?

- On **Thursday, December 8 after 7 p.m.**, the Enrichment Electives Week-at-a-Glance Preview (WAAG) is posted on SYCAMORE
- READ CLOSELY! Esp. this Instruction Page and Course Descriptions
- Review offerings with your child(ren) & make 2 choices per period in order of preference (labeling as “1” and “2”).
- See required courses (e.g., Algebra Practicum for Mrs. Rosenbaum’s 8th grade Algebra students).
- Accreditation requires students to select a variety of classes, so avoid selecting multiple classes of the same type (e.g., P.E., art, music, limit Study Halls to one/student/week due to space restrictions). Even 11th and 12th graders are expected to take Enrichment Electives to further their education rather than seeking to leave early.

➤ AM I ELIGIBLE TO SUBMIT SELECTION FORMS?

- Financial accounts must be current (no delinquencies), including fundraiser opt outs
- Partnership hours must be current (no delinquencies)
- Contact the Admin Office if you have questions about your account.
- For Accounts not current: *Selection Forms assessed a Late Fee of \$50 and entered by Administration on a space-available basis in electives.*

➤ WHEN ARE SELECTION FORMS POSTED & DUE?

- **Fillable Selection Forms posted Tuesday, December 13 after 7 p.m.**
- Select 1st choice & 2nd choice per period on this fillable form (you must select 2 choices); only use this Fillable Selection Form to submit
- **DUE: By 7 p.m. Thursday, December 16, 2022**
- *Selection Forms not received by the due date/time will be assessed a \$50 Late Fee (and those students will be entered by Administration on a space-available basis after other timely selection forms are entered)*

➤ HOW DO I SUBMIT SELECTION FORMS?

- Forms are submitted via email: selections@poetrychristian.org
- Forms not accepted: Do not email early. Use only Fillable Form not a list of selections; do not attempt to submit your Form any other way or personally to any staff member.

➤ HOW ARE SELECTIONS ENROLLED?

- **Space in courses is limited.** Courses are filled on a 1st submitted basis with priority to 11th and 12th graders in meeting graduation credits only.
- Please do not delay in returning your form (e.g., 100+ received within 24 hours after Selection Forms are posted).

- Earlier submission improves chances to get chosen courses.
- Courses are filled to capacity; those with insufficient enrollment are dropped. Affected schedules are adjusted to next choice for that day/period. Note: Team Athletes are not be scheduled for alternative P.E. electives (reserved for non-team students needing P.E. credits.)

➤ CHANGES AFTER SELECTION FORM IS SUBMITTED:

- *Any change requests after you submit your Selection Form are assessed a \$50 Change Fee (unless administratively necessary)*
- **No change requests are allowed after noon on Friday, January 6.**

➤ SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS: High School, esp. 11th/12th Graders

➤ TIPS FOR READING THE ENRICHMENT ELECTIVES WAAG:

- Abbreviations: MS=Middle School (6th-8th); HS = High School (9th - 12th), FA=Fine Art, LOTE=Language other than English, TECH=Computer/Technology, PP=FA Private Pay, CCB=Christian Character-Building/Bible, CTE=Career/Technical Education.
- Teacher/Instructor Name is followed by the Room Assignment in the parentheses of each course listing. Courses in GREEN are two-days.
- Type of graduation credit appears 1st followed by the course title, days offered, instructor name and room assignment.

➤ COURSES WITH SURCHARGES:

- A few courses taught by independent contractor adjunct instructors who charge higher rates (than for other courses) for which a surcharge is due to break even in those courses (e.g., all dance, Drums groups, praise teams, special arts classes, after school instruction or clubs such as Karate Day 2 = \$5/week).
- Other surcharges apply for special classes (e.g., Pottery for self-curing Trinity Industries clay; Cooking for ingredients reimbursement)
- Private Pay (“PP”): FA Private music lessons (electives & after school) and after school private tutoring are paid directly to the teacher-- typically \$20 for 30 minute session.

REQUIRED COURSES:

Algebra Practicum for Rosenbaum Algebra students: All students in Mrs. Rosenbaum's Algebra I course are required to select one Algebra Practicum.

Keyboarding Skills: 6th-9th graders who have not already had this course at PCCS.

SOAR Study Skills: By referral & 6th-9th graders who have not already had this course at PCCS.

SPECIAL SERVICES, BY REFERRAL ONLY:

All grades, Tutoring*: Students struggling with a core subject may enroll subject to approval; limit 2. Tutoring* surcharges are billed lump sum by the semester: FALL Semester - \$180 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$360 for one-on-one.

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS: Rather than drive to a different venue for music lessons, PCCS offers these on campus. Lessons are \$25 for a half period and \$45 for whole periods paid directly to the instructor. Please be prompt with payment. Thank you!

>Private Beginner Piano Lessons* MARISA FRANKUM offers beginning piano to all ages. The curriculum is Faber "My First Piano Adventure for the Young Beginner."

>Private Drum or Guitar/Bass Lessons: MARK AUSTIN continues as a PCCS music instructor; he is a professional career musician who also teaches youth drum and guitar/bass (in fact, his son is a virtuoso musician who has played at the Meyerson many times).

>Private Voice or Piano Lessons: LARISA CARY – Graduate Degree in Music, private music instructor in voice and pian, and former Choir director of large schools continues private lessons AND a Choir offering at PCCS this semester.

REGULAR ENRICHMENT COURSES (alphabetically):

Camping & Survival Skills* NEW! Using the PCCS designated treed camping area behind the baseball field, students learn the basics of camping and survival skills, including cooking, fort building, first aid, lashing, hiking, compass/orienteering skills. *Field trips to Purtils Creek State Park and John Bunker Wetlands planned with a \$10/student fee*

CCB "Christian Soup for the Soul" Teen Talk NEW! This popular series presents stories about connecting with God in spite of the ups and downs of teen life; students will strengthen their faith through these true stories about common and timely topics faced by Christian teens.

CCB Girls Beauty from the Inside Out NEW! The world's expectations of beauty have a lot of influence and promote a value system that needs to be measured up to the Bible; class taught by a professional model who shares how to balance fashion and looks with the heart of our faith in God's Word

CCB Boys God's Man NEW! Young men gain confidence and courage in their faith as they explore what it means to be God's Man in today's culture.

CCB Missions in Action NEW! This class will explore God's plan for serving others, identify needs, develop service projects, assist with planning the MLK Day of Service for PCCS students, network with NHS service projects, and serve those needs of others.

CCB Living By the Book NEW! Using the curriculum by the same title by Howard Hendricks, students learn to really study the Bible in a simple step-by-step fashion...Observe, Let the Scripture reach your individual needs, Interpret, Develop tools and Apply to transform your life.

College & Career In this graduation-requirement 10th and up students learn about college types and tuition, financial options for college costs/FAFSA, aptitudes, majors and degree plans, CTE/Vo-tech, and other exploration projects for post-graduation planning.

COMM Show-N-Tell NEW! This class introduces performance skills in a fun way to our elementary students.

Enneagrams NEW! Explore your tendencies, preferences, and personality attributes through enneagram exploration.

Exam Prep (Math & English, TSI/ACT/SAT/PSAT) Practice the skills needed for college entrance exams; 10th graders and up; *meets HS graduation requirement*

Events Planning NEW! Assist the PCCS Events Manager with planning, organizing, setup and closedown of school events

FA Card Art NEW! A fun art and crafts class to learn skills to make cards.

FA Competition Art Intermediate and advanced arts students are encouraged to enroll to hone their artistic technique toward a product worthy of competition

FA Lettering I NEW! Join Mr. DaSilva (aka Mr. Wilson), a professional Artist, in learning the basics of signs and lettering and to explore your skills and creativity. He will cover a variety of artistic techniques to make this class interesting; meets .25 HS FA credit.

FA Music Fundamentals NEW! Enjoy learning fundamentals of music theory, various instruments, styles of music and performance

FA Music Time / Music & Song NEW! Students will learn familiar and traditional songs (and be included in the spring Theatre production as Chorus members if it is a musical) as well as fundamentals of music through a variety of activities

FA Praise Band – HIGH SCHOOL Team (Formal Practice Period) The team uses this Friday after school session to prepare for Wednesday Chapels and other performances. Meets .5 HS FA credit.

FA Praise Band – MIDDLE SCHOOL Team (Formal Practice Period) NEW! Mark Austin returns to lead Praise Band, meeting (and at other times tbd by the group) to prepare for Wednesday Chapels and other performances. *NOTE: \$12/week surcharge to cover independent contract fee.*

FA Recorders Join Mr. DaSilva (aka Mr. Wilson) in learning the Soprano Recorder instrument as well as Music Theory (which includes reading the music notes). The Soprano Recorder is the most affordable and the easiest instrument to introduce your child to the world of music. *NOTE 2 options: 1) Purchase your own "Soprano Recorder-German Model" (not Baroque) OR 2) purchase one to keep from PCCS for \$10—bring first day of class.*

FA Singing Stars Elementary Chorus NEW! A formal chorus is formed this semester under the direction of graduate degree music instructor, Mrs. Cary, and experience choir director in anticipation of the Spring recital. *Instructor surcharge \$10/week [Pianist sought for this Chorus]*

FA Skits & Stories NEW! Students learn improv and performance skills using a variety of scripts, readers theatre, and stories while gaining confidence in front of others..

FA Theatre—Cast & Crew NEW! Application for the license to perform the popular OKLAHOMA! play and musical is pending; this class time will reduce out of school rehearsal time for lines and songs to be ready for this Spring performance! *Some Friday after school practices required two weeks prior to Performances (click on NOTES for details); meets .5 HS FA credit and lettering points \$25 costume fee if costume provided by PCCS.*

FA/COMM Theatre Sets and Design Join Stage Creative Director, Mrs. Brown, to envision, develop, design, paint, and create sets for this semester's theatre production; meets .25 HS FA credit.

FA Woodworking I* NEW! Using basic woodworking tools, student learn the skills to create easy and fun woodworking projects; meets .25 HS FA credit. *Class supply surcharge: \$25*

Federal Intelligence Roundtable NEW! Learn from the best! Our very own Dr Russo, a former federal investigator, will cover the basics of what goes into investigations at the federal level in this interesting discussion group

FL Introduction to Brazil: Language & Culture NEW! Learn first-hand from Mr. daSilva what Brazil is like including its food (food day included), culture, entertainment, and basic oral language.

FL Spanish Fun / Travel Spanish NEW! A new instructor, Mr. DaSilva (aka Mr. Wilson), offers a fun oral Spanish class as if you were walking through a Spanish-speaking country and needed basic Spanish skills

Health – Head to Toe: All About Me NEW! Students will learn about body systems while practicing their drawing skills using body length paper to represent themselves and those systems.

Health II HS students are required to take Health I and II to graduate; meets Graduation Checklist requirement.

Home Ec: No Heat Required* NEW! Did you know that amazing foods can be prepared without cooking? Learn about food safety, recipe reading, equipment use, clean-up and prepare and eat without heat! \$30 supplies surcharge.

HONORS ENG – Mysteries & Detective Fiction NEW! Students will read and discuss representative authors of this genre including Edgar Allan Poe, Arthur Conan Doyle, GK Chesterton, and Agatha Christie. *NOTE: Honors classes require 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.*

HONORS FA Girls Vocal Ensemble* NEW! Mrs. Cary, a master degreed music instructor with choir conductor experience, has proposed a girls vocal ensemble this semester to take voice to another level (pre-approved or by audition); *instructor/score surcharge \$10/wk*

HONORS DUAL CREDIT MATH CALCULUS I For qualifying math students; *STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT TVCC TO GAIN COLLEGE CREDIT—Check with the College & Career Office for details. NOTE: Honors classes require 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.*

HONORS DUAL CREDIT SOCIOLOGY* NEW! Students gain college credit in this interesting course required for most college majors and transferrable to most colleges that offers theories, research, perspectives...filtered through a Christian focus; *STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT TVCC TO GAIN COLLEGE CREDIT—Check with the College & Career Office for details. NOTE: Honors classes require 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.*

HONORS TECH Yearbook/Instagram Team Students from last semester have enrollment priority and use computer skills, digital photography, and personal creativity to complete this year's Yearbook using an online app; *requires at last two hours outside class time per week to meet deadlines and gain Honors credit; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade; meets .25 HS COMP credit.*

Media Bias & Fake News NEW! What is media bias? What is true news? Students will participate in several projects and simulation games to generate leads, quotes, and transition paragraphs to identify how the public can be misled and reflect/discuss outcomes, including the game "Dog Bites Man" fake news game.

Money Management for Teens. Dave Ramsey In this Dave Ramsey curriculum, teens learn about budgeting, personal finance, interest, taxes, credit cards, and fiscal management. Meets Graduation Credit for Money Mgt/Consumer Math; offered each semester.

PE Archery - Beginning and Intermediate Bryan Goodwin continues as instructor to teach archery skills, safety, and competition skills for the team class under the guidelines of our school's membership in the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP); school-owned bows are available or students may inquire as to what bow may be used after the first day of class; Meets .25 HS P.E. credit.

PE Boys/Girls' JH, JV and Varsity Team Athletics Players work on skills first until the formal season begins (Volleyball-August; Basketball-November; Baseball/Softball-Feb/March as per league rules) with after-school practices required at that time. For basketball team, the class is required in during the Fall & FALL semesters (no new students may join in the FALL semester). Those interested in only Varsity Baseball or Softball should select the 7th period P.E. class for that sport; Game schedules are posted on Sycamore, right sidebar, and on the CALENDAR tab; meets .5 HS PE credit.

PE Cheer Team – Elementary* An in-school practice session to improve tumbling, cheer, consistency, and creativity. *Prerequisite: Enrolled in Fall Semester Cheer Team (or new enrollee via tryout).*

PE Healthy Hustle Guided physical fitness activities will offer students a way to expel extra energy as well as improve gross motor skills and even thinking skills!

PE Karate –Christian Soldiers, White to Black Belts* Choose the belt class that matches the student's belt level at the start of a semester (e.g., white belt = beginners). This nationally recognized program requires Bible memory & Christian character for belt testing; CS karate uniform required. *After-school sessions required for some belts to adequately prepare for belt testing; a semester instructor pass-thru surcharge of \$5/week billed by the semester; for those students who Belt Test, the CS Belt Testing fee is \$35.*

PE Powerwalking For those who may not be interested in team sports, use this class to get fit and gain a .25 P.E. credit toward graduation!

PE Soccer Skills NEW! Students learn and practice the basics from a former semi-pro soccer player.

Science Porch Management A favorite returns! Assist Mrs. Cato with Science Porch organization, housekeeping, animal care, and overall management.

Spring Scientists! NEW! This indoor and outdoor class introduces neat spring time science observations, experiments, and activities in the Science Porch

Story Hour NEW! Student enjoy reading and being read to by guests and older students in this entertaining class.

Study Hall-Proctored Must work on homework or quietly read to remain in class; four school computers are available in the Lewis Room where this is scheduled; responsible use of laptops may be permitted on a case-by-case basis (see school's Internet Policy in all cases including no instant messaging or recreational media); *sleeping or not staying academically busy will result in referral to the campus cleanup team.*

TECH Cartoon Coding NEW! Create a graphic story that looks like a cartoon or animated comic strip using Google Slides or PowerPoint. Integrate creative writing with technology using digital storytelling lessons.

TECH Digital Signage Basics NEW! (new students permitted) Work individually and in teams to use software to develop skills to prepare, proof, edit, and post digital signage on the school's LCD hallway monitors; taught by returning computer instructor, Mrs. Caldwell; meets .25 HS TECH credit.

TECH Minecraft: The class is a Fun interactive class with use of a private server so students are only allowed to interact with each other. Students learn to engage in PVP, mods, and builds. Challenges are also created for all students to hone their skills! .25 HS Tech credit.

TECH Powerpoint In this tech-based course, students gain important presentation skills using Powerpoint, a important skill for life after high school including college and business; meets .25 HS Tech credit.
