COURSE SELECTION INSTRUCTIONS

➤ Enrichment Electives Week-At-A-Glance (WAAG)

- **Tuesday, August 4 after 7 p.m.:** Enrichment Electives Week-at-a-Glance Preview (WAAG) posted on SYCAMORE
- Read closely these Instructions, Course Descriptions, and the WAAG; Review offerings with your child(ren) & make 2 choices per period in order of preference (labeling as “1” and “2”).
- See required courses to select (e.g., CONNECT Circles, Study Skills); read about these on the Course Descriptions page. Accreditors wish to see students in a variety of classes, so avoid selecting multiple classes of the same type (e.g., P.E., art, music).

➤ Selection Sheets

- **Thursday, August 6, after 6 p.m.:** Selection Sheets posted for each grade on Sycamore
- For each child, select the Selection Sheet associated with each child’s grade and complete each selection with choices “1” and “2.”
- Use a separate Selection Sheet for each child in the family according to his/her grade.
- PUT THE NAME AND GRADE AT THE TOP OF YOUR SHEET
- **The email address to send Selection Sheets is listed on the Selection Sheet.** Do not attempt to submit any other way including texting or Pass-a-Note, or personally to any staff member; as it cannot be accepted.
- Courses are filled on a “first come, first served” basis with Seniors having enrollment priority.
- **Financial AND Partnership accounts must be current!** Students with past due accounts (financial or Partnership hours) will not be logged into Electives until their family account is made current. Please contact the Admin Office if you have questions about your account.
- **Monday, August 10 by 7 p.m.:** Selection Sheets due to avoid a \$50 late fee
- **Space in courses is limited, and courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.** Please do not delay in returning your form (e.g., 100+ received within 24 hours after Selection Sheets posted). Earlier submission improves chances to get chosen courses. Preference to 11th-12th graders in meeting necessary credits.
- Courses will be filled to scheduled capacity; those with insufficient enrollment will be dropped. Affected schedules are adjusted to next choice for that day/period. Note: Athletes on teams will not be

scheduled for alternative P.E. electives that are reserved for non-team students needing P.E. credits.

- **CHANGES TO SELECTIONS AFTER SUBMITTED = \$50 Change Fee** for change requests after your Selections are submitted to PCCS.
- **IMPORTANT: NO CHANGE REQUESTS ACCEPTED AFTER the 1st week of electives: August 28, 2026 @ Noon.**

➤ **High School Students, esp. Juniors and Seniors:** To determine what courses you need to graduate on time, see the Graduation Checklist reviewed during your College & Career consultations. ➤ Tips on reading the Enrichment Elective WAAG:

- Abbreviations: MS=Middle School (6th-8th); HS = High School (9th - 12th); FA=Fine Art; LOTE=Language other than English; TECH=Computer/Technology; PP=FA Private Pay; CCB=Christian Character-Building.
- Teacher/Instructor Name is followed by the Room Assignment in the parentheses of each course listing. Courses in GREEN are two-days.
- The type of graduation credit appears 1st (see abbreviations on each page) followed by the course title, days offered, instructor name and room assignment.
- **Course surcharges (“*” on the schedule):**
 - A few courses are taught by independent contractor adjunct instructors (e.g., all Dance, Percussion) who charge higher rates (than for other courses) for which a surcharge is due to break even in those courses.
 - Other surcharges apply for special classes (e.g., sculpting clay; cooking-ingredient instructor reimbursement e.g. \$25; special art classes; after school instruction such as Karate Day 2, e.g. \$5/wk, clubs such as Scouting)
- **FA Private Pay (“PP”):** FA Private music lessons (electives & after school) and after school private Tutoring* are paid directly to the teacher--typically \$25/session.

REQUIRED COURSES

Math Practicums: If you have Mr. Eyre's Honors Algebra, pick one. If you have Mrs. Rosenbaum's Pre-Algebra, pick one. As included in prior semesters, this extra period solidifies essential skills for the next level!

MS Study Skills and Organization I: Students who have NOT had this must select this course either this fall semester or in the spring semester.

TECH Keyboarding In this tech-based world, typing well and fast is an essential school and career skill; students learn and practice the proper and most efficient way of keyboarding. Must take if you have never taken in the past.

Completion Course (Membean/Online Math): Required to take at least 1 6th and 7th graders only (8th-12th have this on Fridays). This is a period for students to complete their Membean and ALEKS/online math without the aid of AI

SPECIAL SERVICES, BY REFERRAL ONLY -- All grades, Tutoring*: Students struggling w/ a core subject may enroll subject to approval; limit 2. *Tutoring* surcharges are billed lump sum by the semester: FALL Semester - \$180 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$360 for one-on-one.*

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS BROUGHT TO YOU

Rather than drive to a different venue for music lessons, PCCS offers these on campus.

IMPORTANT: There are two lessons per period (25 minutes each) which are billed at \$25 paid directly and TIMELY to the instructor.

- Remember, these instructors are talented professionals who, as a courtesy to PCCS, come to our campus; this also saves parents time in commuting to other venues for lessons. LESSONS ARE SCHEDULED BACK-TO-BACK, so please be mindful of this when we schedule your child's lessons.
- YOU MAY NOT DROP LESSONS mid-semester for any reason.
- Please promptly pay; recommended—pay by the month or semester. Thank you!*

>Private Drum or Guitar/Bass Lessons: MARK AUSTIN has been teaching PCCS students for many years and returns to share his love for music with our students. He is a professional career musician who has taught youth the drum kit, bass guitar, electric and acoustic guitar, music theory, and the keyboard (fun fact: his son is a virtuoso musician who has played at the Meyerson many times). Mr. Austin offers private lessons at PCCS on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays 7th – 9th periods plus after school.

REGULAR ENRICHMENT COURSES (alphabetically):

Book Club Join Mrs. Williams to enjoy new book selections for library time!

Book & Tell NEW! A new elective where students engage with new books and participate with show-n-tell activities.

Danger Rangers NEW! Students learn about safety in the home and elsewhere and gain badges for learning accomplishments.

CCB Islam vs. Christianity NEW! Learn the facts about how these differ, the concerns with the Islamic philosophies, historical and more recent events.

College & Career OFFERED ON FRIDAYS for 11th – 12th graders as part of their core schedule. It is a graduation requirement to explore and take steps to plan for after-graduation choices, learn about college types and tuition, CTE/Votech options, financial info for college costs/FAFSA, aptitudes, majors and degree plans, and other exploration projects for post-graduation planning.

Competitive Chess NEW! A favorite returns to prepare for TCAL competition in the spring semester. Join whether you're a beginner or advanced player to learn strategies, enhance your analytical skills, and possibly compete if you're in HS.

COMM Speech Team Get ready to compete in the April competition with oratory, duets, monologues, poetry, prose, etc.; meets .25 HS COMM Speech credit.

Exam Prep II (Math or English, TSI/ACT/SAT/PSAT) Practice the skills needed for college entrance exams; 10th graders and up; *meets HS graduation requirement*

FA Calendar Art NEW! Students will work to create a calendar with seasonal drawings and art work for the upcoming calendar year.

FA Christmas Program NEW! In this enjoyable music class, students learn songs for the December Christmas program. Note: This is not the PCCS Praise Team.

FA Gospel Rap NEW! New teacher, Mr. White, leads this music elective to introduce this new worship genre.

FA Group Guitar NEW! In this small class, students can enjoy learning and improving guitar skills from instructor Mark Austin; no surcharge but bring your instrument or rent one from the school for \$10 a week.

FA Mission Cards NEW! Students will work to create several types of cards for friends, family, teachers and other community helpers.

FA Monochromatic Drawing NEW! Learn from a professional artist to create drawings in black, white, and gray, in anticipation of entering work in competition.

FA Multi-Media Art NEW! Join adjunct instructor and professional artist, Mrs. Smith, to learn how to design and create art with multiple media in anticipation of the spring art competitions *Materials surcharge of \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10*

FA Music Theory 101 NEW! Music and being a musician is more than picking up an instrument or singing; students will learn important basics of music theory.

FA Praise Team The team, by audition, includes vocalist and instrumentalists performs for Chapels. Meets and practices before school tbd, .5 HS FA credit.

FA Sculpting A favorite returns as students learn from professional artist and adjunct instructor, Mrs. Smith; students will create a lovely sculpture bust with terra cotta clay and put their work in the on-campus Fine Art Invitational on campus in April. Also meets .25 HS FA credit. *Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10*

Reminders about PCCS MS, JV, and Varsity Athletics

ATHLETICS BLOCK SCHEDULE (LAST 2 PGS) PLUS FRIDAY AFTERNOONS TO AVOID EARLY MORNING PRACTICES WHICH CAN BE A HARDSHIP FOR MANY STUDENTS AND PARENTS WHO COMMUTE FURTHER AWAY FROM PCCS

PE Athletics: Boys'/Girls' JH, JV and Varsity Teams *Athletes are athletes year-round, so athletes MUST join a sport during off-season.* Players work on skills first until the formal season begins (Football and Volleyball-August; Basketball-November; Baseball/Softball-Feb/March, CX Track-Fall; Track & Field-Spring; as per league rules, AND KARATE provided the student competes in CS Karate Tournaments) with after-school practices required during the season. For basketball team, the class is required during the Fall & Spring semesters (no new mid-term students join after the season is in full swing or after any league cutoff dates). Those interested in only Varsity Baseball or Softball should select a second sport (e.g., fall semester sport like football, basketball, track) or double up in the Spring. Game schedules are posted on Sycamore, right sidebar, and on the CALENDAR tab; meets .5 HS PE credit. **Athletic Team-based Fees: \$200 Varsity, \$150 JV, \$100 MS – THESE ARE PAID THROUGH THE SYCAMORE PAYMENT SYSTEM. Karate is separately invoiced for belt testing and tournaments.**

Health I HS students need Health I and II to graduate; meets Graduation Checklist requirement. Don't put off this important and informative required graduation credit!

HONORS ENG – Epic Poetry: Homer NEW! Join Mr. Beaumont, veteran English college professor and high school faculty, to read and explore selected works from Homer's Iliad and The Odyssey in its entirety. "Epic poetry is the foundation of Western literature, Homer is the foundation of the epic." *NOTE: Honors classes require more prep time outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit and the benefit of the weighted grade.*

HONORS TECH Yearbook Fall semester team is re-enrolled finish assigned pages to produce a polished and competition-worthy Yearbook using computer skills/online app, digital photography, and personal creativity; **requires at least two hours outside class time per week to meet deadlines and gain Honors credit;** *must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade; meets .25 HS COMP credit. Two Siberias for not meeting assignments will result in removal from the class.*

HONORS Aviation Test Prep NEW! Join this new course to prepare to take your private pilot's license test.

Money Management for Teens, Dave Ramsey Teens learn essential information and skills on budgeting, personal finance, interest, taxes, credit cards, and fiscal management. Meets Graduation Credit requirement; offered each semester.

Math Games Everyone loves games, and in this class math skills are improved through fun math games!

Money Matters for Kids Even young students need to learn the importance of stewardship. They learn through fun and creative tools to understand and apply the Biblical concept of stewardship through jokes, puzzles, and other fun activities and exercises to learn Godly money management principles.

Missions *NOTE: Moved to alternate Fridays for 8th-12th graders; Led by new teacher and Christian-Character Building Director, Spencer Grant; as Christ followers and as part of the Great Commission, we are called to serve and to give of our time, tithe, and talents and this*

missions class enables that for Teachers of the Week and local needs (e.g., nursing homes, refuge camp in Kaufman)...let's serve others together!

HS Nelson University Online Dual Credit Study Session periods to complete online

courses In this period, students who are registered for NU online have a proctored time to complete assignments for their college credit; you can take 1 or more of these, your choice!

Pardon Me! NEW! (Ever wonder where basic manners have gone when you're in town or at social events or when you are social networking? PE Archery Coach Boone leads to teach safety and competition skills for the team class under the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP); tournament participation required. School-owned bows available or students may purchase their own approved bow; Meets .25 HS P.E. credit.

PE Cheer Team – Elementary (Minis and Star Squad), Upper (Spirit Squad)* Elementary (Minis and Star Squad), Upper (Spirit Squad)*. Performances occur at Pep Rallies and selected games; practice sessions required to improve tumbling, cheer, consistency, and creativity. Fees depend on team and the needs of that team. Elementary cheer will start in September and have one after school practice a week. More information to come. Cheer Bylaws control expectations and fees.

PE Ball Skills Our youngest students learn and improve skills in basketball and baseball/softball skills from Coach Hart in this fun fitness and skills-building class.

PE Dance – FAITH BLAZERS [NOT A FALL OFFERING; LOOK FOR THIS IN THE SPRING SEMESTER] A professional dance teacher from Dallas, Alexa Taylor, teaches dance and collaborates with students on choreography to Christian music for performances and a recital. Meets .25 HS FA or PE credit. *Surcharge uniform for unless parents purchase dance uniform/shirt directly.*

PE Fitness Fun Indoor and outdoor guided physical fitness and game activities with body movement offer a way to expel extra energy as well as improve gross motor skills and self-control!

PE Karate –Christian Soldiers, White to Black Belts* Choose the belt class that matches the student's belt level at the start of a semester (e.g., white belt = beginners). This nationally recognized program requires Bible memory & Christian character for belt testing; CS karate uniform required. *After-school sessions required for GOLD BELTS AND HIGHER to adequately prepare for belt testing; a semester instructor pass-thru surcharge of \$5/week billed by the semester; for those students who Belt Test, the CS Belt Testing fee is \$35.*

PE Leap-n-Learn NEW! Educational activities are combined with exercises to achieve dual outcomes in this fun energetic brain and body fit class, <https://www.education.com/activity/fitness-and-exercise/>,

Saluting Service NEW! Senior Check Out Qualifying 12th graders can request to leave campus during 8th and 9th periods M, T, W, and/or Th to complete self-study or work study. Qualifications: Graduation Credits met with current schedule, entrance exams completed as applicable, Honor Roll GPA.

Completion Class Given the “benefits” of AI, it is important that 6th and 7th graders complete Membean, ALEKS/online math with a teacher proctor; MUST select one per week in the 8th or 9th period (*NOTE: 8th-12th graders have this in the core Friday schedule so they do not need to sign up in the 8th or 9th periods*).

T.A. Do you want to be a teacher or a coach in the future? Do you need to help your family with Partnership Hours (esp. international students)? Consider being a TA for a class or a student coaching assistant; pre-approved by the College & Career office.

TECH Fix It Tech NEW! Students learn more about the hardware of computers, laptops, ancillary equipment, maintenance and repair of tech equipment, and tagging.

TECH Podcast Thinktank NEW! Under the guidance of Mr. Grant, 4-6 high schoolers will assist with planning and developing the 12:12 podcast (based on Corinthian 12:12).

TECH Computer Science I NEW! Students learn from a seasoned computer teacher, Mr. Owen, in this computer science elective.

TECH Techno Digital Citizenship A fun intro to the Internet to safely discover online resources and responsible digital citizenship to master responsible search strategies, collect bookmarks, assess website trustworthiness, respect copyright, address cyberbullying, and develop a digital resiliency plan to become safe and informed evaluators of online information and encourage a culture of inquiry.

PCCS Scouting General Information for Guys and Girls, All Grades* This program's charter is RESTRICTED to PCCS enrolled students only, and for guys or gals of all ages; new students welcome. **What do they learn and experience?** Everything from wilderness survival, first aid, navigation, knot craft, citizenship, healthy living, fitness, sciences, trades, business, and service while improving team building, personal mgt., leadership, and confidence. This amazing, fun, industrious, adventurous, and creative learning and goal setting program is offered thru veteran scout leaders, Mrs. Cato and Mrs. Jorzig. *So, don't let what you hear about scouting outside of PCCS deter you from choosing this rewarding program here at PCCS!* A monthly scout meeting is required after school, as well as several fun activities and events like camp! There is a required parent meeting after the semester starts to learn more. PCCS provides Scouting Handbooks. T-shirts must be worn on SCOUT DAYS (the day you have class).
