- See required courses to select (e.g., CONNECT Circles, Study Skills); read about these on the Course Descriptions page. Accreditors wish to see students in a variety of classes, so avoid selecting multiple classes of the same type (e.g., P.E., art, music).

- Thursday, August 10, after 9 p.m.: Selection Sheets posted for each grade on Sycamore
- For each child, select the Selection Sheet associated with each child's grade and complete each selection with choices "1" and "2."
- Use a separate Selection Sheet for each child in the family according to his/her grade.
- PUT THE NAME AND GRADE AT THE TOP OF YOUR SHEET
- The email address to send these is listed on the Selection Sheet. Do not attempt to submit any other way including texting or Pass-a-Note, or personally to any staff member; as it cannot be accepted.
- Courses are filled on a "first come, first served" basis with Seniors having enrollment priority.
- <u>Financial AND Partnership accounts must be current!</u> Students with past due accounts (financial or Partnership hours) will not be logged into Electives until their family account is made current. Please contact the Admin Office if you have questions about your account.
- Saturday, August 12, by 9 p.m.: Selection Sheets due to avoid a \$50 late fee
- Space in courses is limited, and courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Please do not delay in returning your form (e.g., 100+ received within 24 hours after Selection Sheets posted). Earlier submission improves chances to get chosen courses. Preference to 11th-12th graders in meeting necessary credits.
- Courses will be filled to scheduled capacity; those with insufficient enrollment will be dropped. Affected schedules are adjusted to next choice for that day/period. Note: Athletes on teams will not be

- scheduled for alternative P.E. electives that are reserved for non-team students needing P.E. credits.
- A \$50 Change Fee due for changes received after your Selections are submitted to PCCS. No change requests accepted after Friday, August 25.
- ➤ <u>High School Students, esp. Juniors and Seniors</u>: To determine what courses you need to graduate on time, see the Graduation Checklist reviewed during your College & Career consultations. > Tips on reading the Enrichment Elective WAAG:

- Abbreviations: MS=Middle School (6th-8th); HS = High School (9th 12th), FA=Fine Art, LOTE=Language other than English, TECH=Computer/Technology, PP=FA Private Pay, CCB=Christian Character-Building,
- Teacher/Instructor Name is followed by the Room Assignment in the parentheses of each course listing. Courses in GREEN are two-days.
- The type of graduation credit appears 1st (see abbreviations on each page) followed by the course title, days offered, instructor name and room assignment.
- Course surcharges ("*" on the schedule):
 - A few courses are taught by independent contractor adjunct instructors (e.g., all Dance, Percussion) who charge higher rates (than for other courses) for which a surcharge is due to break even in those courses.
 - Other surcharges apply for special classes (e.g., Pottery-self-curing Trinity Industries clay; Cooking-ingredient instructor reimbursement e.g. \$25; Praise/Worship Teams \$10/wk; special art classes; after school instruction or clubs such as Karate Day 2, e.g. \$5/wk)
- FA Private Pay ("PP"): FA Private music lessons (electives & after school) and after school private Tutoring* are paid directly to the teacher--typically \$25/session.

REQUIRED COURSES:

Keyboarding Skills: 6th-9th graders who have not already had this course at PCCS. SOAR Study Skills: By referral PLUS 6th-9th graders who have not already had this course at PCCS.

SPECIAL SERVICES, BY REFERRAL ONLY:

All grades, Tutoring*: Students struggling w/ a core subject may enroll subject to approval; limit 2. Tutoring* surcharges are billed lump sum by the semester: FALL Semester - \$180 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$360 for one-on-one.

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS: Rather than drive to a different venue for music lessons, PCCS offers these on campus.

<u>>Private Beginner Piano Lessons*</u> MARISA FRANKUM MK offers beginning piano to all ages on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, 7th and 8th periods. The curriculum is Faber "My First Piano Adventure for the Young Beginner."

➤Private Drum or Guitar/Bass Lessons: MARK AUSTIN continues as a PCCS music instructor; he is a professional career musician who also teaches youth drum and guitar/bass (in fact, his son is a virtuoso musician who has played at the Meyerson many times) on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays 7th – 10th periods.

<u>CCB Girls: Ten Women of the Bible NEW!</u> Using the Study Guide of the same title, by Jenna Lucado Bishop, discover and discuss how Sarah, Rahab, Abigail, Esther, Mary-Mother of Jesus, The Samaritan Woman, The Canaanite Woman, Mary of Bethany, Mary Magdalene and Sapphira changed the world. <u>College & Career</u> In this graduation-requirement 10th and up students learn about college types and tuition, financial options for college costs/FAFSA, aptitudes, majors and degree plans, CTE/Vo-tech, and other exploration projects for post-graduation planning.

<u>COMM Show-N-Tell</u> This class introduces performance skills in a fun way to our younger students.

<u>COMM Speech Competition</u> This class will introduce and help prepare students to compete in ACSI / TAPPS events in the spring; events include oratory, poetry, dramatic/humorous interp, etc. Meets .25 HS COMM Speech credit.

Exam Prep (Math & English, TSI/ACT/SAT/PSAT) Practice the skills needed for college entrance exams; 10th graders and up; meets HS graduation requirement)

Events Planning I (this is a two-semester course; must be in I to choose Part 2 in the Spring)
Students assist the PCCS Events Mgr w/ planning, organizing, setup and closedown of school events

FA Calendar Art A favorite returns! Students use the fall semester to make and decorate w/ drawings and art a 2024 calendar.

FA Clay Sculpture I NEWI Join professional artist and new adjunct instructor, Shelly Kolman Smith, to learn to work w/ terra cotta clay to bring imagination to life! Sculptures will be fired and glazed. Students start w/ a simple slab pot and move on to a coil pot to get the feel for the clay. By semester end, you will create fun portrait busts (emphasis on fun, creative faces). Enjoy your imagination and be inspired to great things! Meets .25 HS FA credit. Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10 FA Competition Art Intermediate and advanced arts students are encouraged to enroll to hone their artistic technique toward a product worthy of competition. Prerequisite: Prior drawing/painting classes. FA Craftastic NEWI In this new art elective, join an EC-12 Art Certified teacher, Mrs. Denney, to create a variety of craftastic projects. Meets .25 HS FA credit.

FA Praise Songs Students will learn familiar pop and traditional Praise songs in this fun class!

FA Praise Band – HIGH SCHOOL Team (Formal Practice Period) The team uses this Friday after school session to prepare for Wednesday Chapels and other performances. Meets .5 HS FA credit.

FA Praise Band – MIDDLE SCHOOL Team (Formal Practice Period) NEW! Students with vocal and instrumental talent practice together during this period (and at other times tod by the group) to prepare for Wednesday Chapels and other performances. Parent Partner musician sought to assist.

FA Sheep to Shawl I (this is two-semester class; must take I to take part II in the Spring) NEW!

Join new adjunct instructor and professional artist, Shelly Kolman Smith, to learn how to take a raw, straight off the sheep fleece and pick out the debris/vegetable matter. After that, we scour and clean it from the lanolin and gnarly stuff. Once clean and dry, students card the wool, preparing it to be spun and dyed. Along the way, students learn the differences in sheep varieties, wool they produce, and how delightful it is to raise sheep. Depending upon progress, we may begin spinning at the end of semester.

<u>PART 2/Spring Semester</u>: Finish spinning as needed, practice knitting, crocheting and weaving on store bought wool. Then students jump in to work with the good stuff and make shawls (maybe for Mother's Day)! <u>Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10</u>

FA Wearable Art NEW! Join new adjunct instructor and professional artist, Shelly Kolman Smith, as she guides students in creating hand painted silk scarves, tie dye shirts, and other items like napkins, tote bags and towels...transforming a plain white t-shirt into a wearable piece of art or to felt accessories with wool (upper grades will make custom leather sandals to complete the ensemble, while lower grades make beaded jewelry); a fashion show may be the grand finale! Meets .25 HS FA credit. Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10

FA Elementary Theatre ("A Brilliant Turtleoot Christmas")—Cast & Crew NEW! PCCS is known for it's "out-of-the-box creative" theatre program. To prepare for yet another fun, fantastical production w/ a "moral to the story" for the holiday season, this is two-day class w/ some Friday after school practices required two weeks prior to Performance); \$25 costume fee if costume provided by PCCS.

FL Tourist Spanish NEW! If you want to travel to a Spanish speaking country, this is the class for you! Enjoy learning the basics of verbal Spanish with Mrs. O!

Health, Safety & Manners NEW! Students will learn about how to be healthy, nutrition, how to be safe, and manners!

<u>Health I HS</u> students need Health I and II to graduate; meets Graduation Checklist requirement. Don't put off this important and informative required graduation credit!

HONORS DUAL CREDIT! ENG – British Lit II NEW! British Lit, the Romantics to the moderns. Course will cover such authors as Wordsworth, Coleridge, Keats, Tennyson, the Brownings, Hopkins, Conrad, Yeats, Joyce and TS Eliot; STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT TVCC TO GAIN COLLEGE CREDIT—PAN Mrs. Stapleton for details. NOTE: Honors classes require 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit: weighted grade

HONORS DUAL CREDIT PSYCHOLOGY (Dual Credit Sociology offered in the Spring)* NEW! Students gain college credit in this interesting course required for most college majors and transferrable to most colleges that offers theories, research, perspectives...filtered through a Christian lens; STUDENTS MUST REGISTER AT TVCC TO GAIN COLLEGE CREDIT—Check w/ the College & Career Office for details. NOTE: Honors classes require 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.

HONORS FA Girls Vocal Performance Ensemble* NEW HONORS! Mrs. Cary, a master degreed music instructor w/ choir conductor experience leads this group; prior members, vocal experience in a group or soloist, prior vocal competition, or an audition required to join; end of semester recital and spring semester competition planned. Instructor surcharge \$12/week [Parent Partner or other pianist sought for this group]

HONORS TECH Yearbook x 2 NEW! To improve efficiency and distribute work load, the team is split into two teams: the Events & Athletics Team and the Classes Team (the staff/faculty/leadership pages will be done by the instructor); students from last semester have enrollment priority and use computer skills, digital photography, and personal creativity to complete this year's Yearbook using an online app; taught by a favorite instructor, Kim Townsend wiith Tele-Editor PCCS Alum Morgan Horan; requires at last two hours outside class time per week to meet deadlines and gain Honors credit; must have 80%+average to gain credit; weighted grade; meets .25 HS COMP credit.

<u>Lit Circle NEW!</u> During the first session, students will choose a novel as a group to read as a Lit Circle. <u>Money Management for Teens, Dave Ramsey</u> In this Dave Ramsey curriculum, teens learn about budgeting, personal finance, interest, taxes, credit cards, and fiscal management. Meets Graduation Credit for Money Mqt/Consumer Math; offered each semester.

PE Archery - Beginning and Intermediate Bryan BG continues as instructor to teach archery skills, safety, and competition skills for the team class under the guidelines of our school's membership in the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP); school-owned bows are available or students may inquire as to what bow may be used after the first day of class; Meets .25 HS P.E. credit.

PE Boys'/Girls' JH, JV and Varsity Team Áthletics Players work on skills first until the formal season begins (Volleyball-August; Basketball-November; Baseball/Softball-Feb/March as per league rules) w/

after-school practices required at that time. For basketball team, the class is required in during the Fall & FALL semesters (no new students may join in the FALL semester). Those interested in only Varsity Baseball or Softball should select the 7th period P.E. class for that sport; Game schedules are posted on Sycamore, right sidebar, and on the CALENDAR tab; meets .5 HS PE credit. Athletic Team-based Fees: \$200 Varsity, \$150 JV, \$100 MS NEW! PAID THROUGH THE SYCAMORE PAYMENT SYSTEM.

PE Cheer Team – Elementary (Star Squad), Upper (Spirit Squad)* Performances occur at the Pep Rallies and selected games; practice sessions to improve tumbling, cheer, consistency, and creativity; moved to after school due to the new Co-ed Sports Teams in 7th period. Athletic Team-based Fee: \$150 NEW! PAID THROUGH THE SYCAMORE PAYMENT SYSTEM (includes practice shirt, bow, bag plus rental of uniforms and pom poms); parents responsible for white socks/shoes as per the Cheer Bylaws. PE Golf Skills NEW! Join new coach and Athletics Assistant, Jacie Elliott, to learn golf skills and how to play golf. Those w/ more advanced skills may be scheduled for Friday after school practices to prepare for competition.

PE Move & Groove NEW! Guided physical fitness and game activities with body movement offers students a way to expel extra energy as well as improve gross motor skills and self-control!

PE Karate – Christian Soldiers, White to Black Belts* Choose the belt class that matches the student's belt level at the start of a semester (e.g., white belt = beginners). This nationally recognized program requires Bible memory & Christian character for belt testing; CS karate uniform required. After-school sessions required for GOLD BELTS AND HIGHER to adequately prepare for belt testing; a semester instructor pass-thru surcharge of \$5/week billed by the semester; for those students who Belt Test, the CS Belt Testing fee is \$35.

PE FaithYoga NEW! Strength & Stretching Join this healthy Christian-based class to get stronger, more flexible, and in tune with Jesus! Taught by registered Holy Yoga instructor/registered masters FaithYoga/12/23 instructor, Dr. H. Meets .25 PE FA credit.

PE Victory: Interpretive Dance NEW! Dance teacher, Mrs. Benton, teaches interpretative dance to Christian music to prepare for end of semester recital with eyes toward possible TAPPs competition. Meets .25 HS FA or PE credit. Surcharge for unless parents purchase dance uniform/shirt directly.

Study Hall-Proctored Must work on homework or quietly read to remain in class; four school computers are available in the Lewis Room where this is scheduled; responsible use of laptops may be permitted on a case-by-case basis (see school's Internet Policy--including no instant messaging or recreational media); sleeping or not staying academically busy will result in referral to the campus cleanup team.

TECH Canva Digital Signage NEW! Join the PCCS Tech & Media Specialist, Jordan McCaleb, to work individually and in teams using software to develop skills to prepare, proof, edit, and post digital signage on the school's LCD hallway monitors; meets .25 HS TECH credit.

TECH Digital Stories NEW! Students use their imaginations and innovative technology to create a digital story that looks like a cartoon or animated comic strip that, when done, is published as a link with the slides set to play automatically. Challenging digital storytelling activities support learning with optional assignments such as animation techniques, collaborative peer-editing, or screencasting.

TECH Pioneer Post NEW! Students use technology (Program: TechnoNewsletter) to prepare and distribute their own fun and entertaining student newsletter (the "Pioneer Post"); students learn valuable word processing skills such as formatting text, arranging objects, adjusting page layout, working with tables, referencing information sources, and inserting headers or footers; challenging enrichment activities support learning with optional assignments that explain how to work with images, create a collage, co-author an article, and more.
